

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

The Lutheran Church is a teaching and confessing church that centers itself around the Word of the gospel of Jesus Christ and the Sacraments. Each month we are going through The Augsburg Confession which is the summary of our beliefs and what we have in common with the whole Christian church. This month we will look at the Thirteenth article.

"Concerning the use of sacraments, it is taught that the sacraments are instituted not only to be signs by which people may recognize Christians outwardly, but also as signs and testimonies of God's will toward us in order to awaken and strengthen our faith. This is why they also require faith and are rightly used when received in faith for the strengthening of faith."

The Word and Sacraments are marks of the church. They are signs of Christians in community but they are not magic or something we bring to them to make them effective. They are gifts from God to us. They are promises of God for us to receive by faith. Wengert explains, God gives the sacraments to embrace us, physical beings that we are, in his love and grace. Failing to ask God's intent in giving the sacraments misses their down-to-earth meaning completely. This is what God is doing for us and God's will toward us. In baptism, God wills o declare us his children; in the supper, Christ wills to feed us his body and blood for the forgiveness of sin; in absolution, the Holy Spirit continues our daily baptism by putting the old creature to death and raising up the New Creature of faith. God is continually drawing near to us and saying, You are mine! You are my beloved child! God's unconditional promise draws us to himself. As the hymn goes, "What wondrous love is this, O my soul. I'll sing God's love for me, and through eternity I will sing! The Word and sacraments give us Jesus!

While some people devalue the promise of baptism but Jesus risks blessing the children and whole families are called to enter the waters through faith. Wengert says, the Lord's Supper seems so foolish: a morsel of bread and a sip of wine and it's over. Yet here, too the action proclaims that Christ is truly present with his body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. "How is Christ present?" Luther and later Lutherans were asked. Don't ask mathematical questions, Luther replied. The whole point rests upon the foolish announcement by Christ: Take, eat, this is my Body. Drink of it, all of you, this is the blood of the New Testament." Even the words of absolution gives the Unconditional mercy of God in Christ that You are forgiven!

All three sacraments deliver God's promise oof forgiveness, life, and salvation. There is no better news for the sinner, for the dying, or for the lost. Good news for us. Making Jesus Known starts by gathering around the Word and Sacraments and sharing the good news of Jesus love for all.
