



Pastor's Page

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

We have been looking at Lutheran Cards by Pastor Dave Daubert that talks about the basics of the Lutheran faith using a stack of cards to explain it. I am going to go through these points each month in our newsletter. The first Card was the Ace-There is no way to God (Period) God comes to us. The Second Card was the "The King. The God revealed in Christ is different. "The King' is Jesus who reveals God is love. The crucified and Risen Jesus stands as the central figure in our faith. The Third card is the Queen-Grace for us includes hope for others. As Lutheran Christians we emphasize grace. Grace is unconditional and comes freely as a gift by faith alone. If God is gracious to us, we should be gracious to others.

Last month we looked at the Jack- Vocation of the Baptized. As baptized children of God we all have a calling and vocation from God. Holy Calling is not just for pastors, Sunday School, Bible teachers, and people who work at the church. Luther's insight was that God can and does use you anywhere.

This month we are looking at the Ten Card-Priesthood of all Believers which expands on the vocation of the baptized. Daubert says, 'Because Christ has come to us in Christ and is present and accessible to all who have faith, all Christians have the ability and the calling to serve as priests (ministers) for their neighbors.' It is also called the priesthood of all the baptized. There's a phrase that is attributed to Martin Luther that says we are to be "little Christs" for each other. Luther never said that. However, he said we are to "be Christ for each other." The focus on the priesthood of all believers is that our focus should be on our identity in the Crucified Risen Christ for others. We are called to be Christ's true presence in our communities in which we live and serve. As Pastor Daubert says, "Faithful Christians are called to pray, speak, and act in priestly ways within the natural flow of our lives. It would change how we interact with each other, with neighbors and co-workers, and how we lived with our families in our own homes." This Card goes with Bethel's own Mission statement of "Making Jesus Known."




Next month we will be looking at the 9th card that Life is Sacramental.

The summary above is for the first ten months of each year, 2024 and 2025.

The online giving via Sage is showing a slight improvement, but the regular giving via worship offerings is dramatically down in 2025 when compared to the same time-frame of 2024.

Please note: if 40 families raised their tithing by \$10 per week, it would raise \$20,800 over a year and completely eliminate the existing deficit.
