

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

The Lutheran Church is a teaching and confessing church that centers itself around the Word of the gospel of Jesus Christ and the Sacraments. Each month we are going through The Augsburg Confession which is the summary of our beliefs and what we have in common with the whole Christian church. This month we will look at the tenth article.

"Concerning the Lord's Supper they teach that the body and blood of Christ are truly present and are distributed to those who eat the Lord's Supper."

Lutherans stick with God's promise that Jesus words mean what they say. Jesus says, This is my body and this is my blood given for you as he held up the bread and the wine. Timothy Wengert talks about asking a question to children in a First Communion Class:

"How do we know Christ is present in the Lord's Supper?" I asked. "Because Jesus promises to show up." Silence. "Come on, Michelle, this is important." Still silence, and her fair skin begin to turn red. Her parents slumped in the cushions. "Pastor Tim, I don't know." "Right answer!" I exclaimed. "Oh, Pastor!" she sighed.

Lutherans insist absolutely that with the bread and wine Christ is truly present with the body and blood. Our certainty rests on the promise: "This is my body! That is, "Here I am! So that as close as the bread comes to your teeth and the wine to your lips, so close does Jesus come to you with his body and blood."*

That is the good news and one of the ways that God comes to us for forgiveness and strength to remind us of Christ's unconditional promise to not only show up in the Word but also in the waters of baptism and to show up in his meal: "This is my body and blood given for you for the forgiveness of sins."

We do not explain Holy Communion(Lord's Supper/Eucharist) but we receive it by faith. The real bodily presence is a mystery but is a gift for us. This Sunday and every time you are gathered at the table you are partaking the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world right here, in the bread and wine. Amen.
