Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

We are getting closer to the end of our series on the Augsburg Confession. The Lutheran Church is a teaching and confessing church that centers itself around the Word of the gospel of Jesus Christ and the Sacraments. Each month we are going through The Augsburg Confession which is the summary of our beliefs and what we have in common with the whole Christian church. This month we will look at the Eleventh article.

"Concerning confession it is taught that private absolution should be retained and not abolished. However, it is not necessary to enumerate all misdeeds and sins, since it is not possible to do so. Psalm 19:12:"But who can detect their errors?"

In Forde and Nestigen's book on the Small Catechism, Free To Be, with Luther's explanation of private confession conclude that is virtually unknown among many American Lutherans. They begin with the question: "What has happened to private confession? Answer: The Old Adam stole it from us." It is true that our churches practice a General Confession and Absolution in our worship services but the use of private confession is sadly lacking in our churches. Why? Many complain it is unbiblical or too Roman Catholic but the early Lutherans practiced private confession because it delivers the word of forgiveness one to one. Private Confession, like its twin, Public Confession, allows people to hear the gospel addressed directly to their conscience. Many people today still struggle with guilt and shame and the neglect of this sacrament of absolution causes many to live in despair. Who does not want to hear that they are loved and forgiven in Christ? Some feel like they are too far gone to receive the grace and mercy of God or worse think they are too righteous enough to need it. Remember we are both Saint and Sinner and depend totally on the grace and mercy of God alone. Many times people in recovery groups like AA (Alcoholics Anonymous) understand Confession better than church people. Those in 12step programs knows one does not graduate from being an addict to non-addict only a recovering addict. The key to proper confession is to confess one is a sinner, and at the same time, to hear the absolution and believes it truly applies to the one confessing and makes them righteous. In our worship services this is why we begin with General Confession and Absolution to prepare one's heart for worship and to receive Holy Communion which also gives us Jesus. We come to hear the Word of the gospel that we are loved, forgiven in Jesus name! My office is always open to deliver you the good news.


