

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

The Lutheran Church is a teaching and confessing church that centers itself around the Word of the gospel of Jesus Christ and the Sacraments. Each month we are going through The Augsburg Confession which is the summary of our beliefs and what we have in common with the whole Christian church. This month we will look at the Fourth article. This is appropriate for the season of Easter where we are meditating and focusing on the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Fourth article deals with Justification by grace through faith in Christ alone!

"Furthermore, it is taught that we cannot obtain forgiveness of sin and righteousness before God through our merit, work, or satisfactions, but that we receive forgiveness of sins and become righteous before God out of grace for Christ's sake through faith when we believe that Christ has suffered for us and that for his sake our sin is forgiven and righteousness and eternal life is given to us. For God will regard and reckon this faith as righteousness in his sight, as St. Paul says in Romans 3 and 4.".

The problem with some form of Christianities is the focus on a "before and after" of the Christian faith. Wengert describes this as the "Up Religion." This is humans who have fallen away from God and try to climb the ladder and work their way back up. The problem with that approach our focus is no longer on God but on our works to follow the rules so God will love and bless us but the problem is that we are never sure if we prayed enough, was sincere enough, and was our decision truly from the heart. This leads to despair and the loss of faith or a deception that you are a good Christian based on all of your works. When we replace the good news of God's divine rescue if us through Christ's life, death, and resurrection with our own works we are following a different religion. God's love and grace is unconditional, and we receive through faith in Christ alone. Christ's faithfulness saves us. It is not our work. It is God's favor and mercy alone that saves us.

Timothy Wengert tells a story about a former student who told him how she became Lutheran. Fifteen years as a Roman Catholic, she had gone to confession and received from the priest a list of things she needed to do to show her penitence. Because she never did them, she kept feeling guilty and stopped going to church altogether. (Not to pick on some RC churches but some evangelical churches also give you a long list of demands as well) In college, a friend invited her to come to his Lutheran Church. At the beginning of the service, the congregation started with the general confession of sins, and all of her guilt came flooding back, reminding her why she had given up on religion. But then the pastor turned to the congregation and said "You are forgiven in Jesus' name." Shocked at what she was hearing, she burst out "Is that it?" Yes, that is it, not just for her but for all who have ears to hear: Christ's righteousness is ours, and our sin belongs to Christ, once for all.\* This is the good news for you.
